







Oregon COVID-19 Daily Update Summary as of Saturday 04/11/2020

On March 27, EPA issued a Reid Vapor Pressure (RVP) waiver, allowing companies to continue using the existing surplus supply of winter blend fuels remaining in the system after May 1. Oregon has more stringent requirements. ODOE is working with the Oregon Department of Agriculture (ODA) and DEQ to ensure all state conditions for a RVP waiver are addressed
